

On behalf of all the Team Members, I need your wishes, so that we may maintain the Glory and Decorum of the school.





Report: Science Exhibition







Fukushima-Daiichi Nuclear Disaster

Fears of radio-activity releases led to 20 km evacuation around the plant. Measurements taken by Japanese science ministry showed radio-active cesium levels high enough to cause concern. Food grown in the area was banned from sale. The releasing iodine-131 and cesium- 137 are of the same order of magnitude as those from Chernobyl in 1986. Plutonium contamination has been deleted in the soil at two sites, in the plant. Foreign experts have said that a workforce in the hundred or even thousands would take years or decades to clean up the area.

The Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Disaster is a series of equipment failures, nuclear meltdowns and releases of radio-active materials at the Fukushima I nuclear power plant, following the tohoku earthquake and tsunami on 11 March, 2011. It is the largest nuclear accident since the 1986 Chernobyl disaster. At the time of earthquake, reactors shut down automatically with emergency generations starting up to run the control on electronics and water- pumps needed to cool reactions. The entire plant was flooded by the 15 m tsunami waves including the external pumps for supplying cooling sea waters. They both damage hindered external assistance.

Objectives of L.H.C.

L.H.C. stands for large hadron collider which is a project of C.E.R.N. as it is understandable from its name which means a large machine which help in collision of sub-atomic particle. This machine is a circular tunnel of length 27 KM and beneath town of Geneva. This machine is built to get answers of question which are still unsolved. Some of them are:

- I. Why anti-matter got disappeared mysteriously after big-bang?
- II. To get technology to do cold fusion.
- III. To know whether Higgs-Boson particle really exist?
- IV. What is dark-matter?
- V. It is possible to travel at more than speed of light or simply time travelling to future.
- It is one of the most troubling questions for physicist. It is stated that before Big-bang universe was
 composed of 50% matter and 50% anti-matter. So, why it got disappeared after big-bang. In L.H.C.
 machine scientist have been able to produce and store anti-hydrogen for 20 min. if we will be able to
 get answer of it and produce it in mass then it will be a matter of time for 99.99 efficient fuels. When
 matter and anti-matter come in contact they get disappeared with release of tremendous energy in
 very efficient way.
- Fusion means to fuse or join. Nuclear fusions require a lot of high pressure and high temperature which
 is possible for only experiment. But if scientists are able to dousion at room temperature or cold fusion then
 every house will have their own power plant. Avera, a French company has signed deal with C.E.R.N to
 provide cold fusion plant to power every house.
- D.R. Higgs, Ph'D in physics has given a theory that after big-bang Higgs-boson particle came in to
 existence as it is also a piece of solution of puzzle to know about our universe. At CERN scientist has
 partial success.
- Dark –matter is a vital part of our universe as 25% of universe is composed of it. It was discovered in 1990s when scientist saw a ray of light from a star bend towards an area where there was nothing. Also today it still remains a mystery.
- 5. The Einstein's theory of relativity states that no object can travel at the speed or more than speed of light but only, can reach up to 99.999999% of it. It is also known as 'Traffic Rule of Universe'. But at CERN or L.H.C. the scientist claimed that when they fired neutrino (a sub-atomic particle having no charge and is undetectable when pass through matter) they were 60 nanosecond faster than speed of light which is impossible according to theory of relativity. The scientists are still checking their calculation and are repeating experiment for a solid proof. If this happens then it will be of no surprise that as 'theory are made to be proved wrong' as was matter of time for us to be time traveler of future and a new application will come into existence and influence our life.


We are just 10 seconds old?....



Science One Step Closer To Less Energy

Intensive Artificial Photosynthesis

Artificial photosynthesis is the process with the main purpose of converting carbon-dioxide into some useful chemical (8), most notably fuel. The primary goal of artificial photosynthesis is not to find new ways to get more fuel but to reduce carbon-dioxide and reduce climate impact.

The main problem with artificial photosynthesis has always been the fact that this process is too energy intensive. This mainly refers to the first step of artificial photosynthesis namely converting carbon dioxide into carbon monoxide because this process requires so much electricity that the end result is that the bigger amount of energy is being used to produce the fuel than can be stored in the fuel.

Because of this issue science has a demanding desk of finding a night catalyst that will improve artificial photosynthesis and make it less energy intensive.

The latest research on this field comes from the University of Illinois where scientists have used an ionic liquid to catalyze the reactions which has significantly reduced the amount of energy to turn carbon –dioxide in to carbon monoxide because the ionic liquids stabilize the intermediates in the reaction so that less electricity is needed to complete the conversion.

However this is still not enough to make the process of artificial photosynthesis economically viable because researchers still need to find the way to speed up the reaction and maximize conversion.

But as university all illinois chemical and biological engineering professor Paul ken said: "more work is needed, but this research brings us a significant step closer to reducing our dependence on fossil fuels while simultaneously reducing CO2 animations that are linked to unwanted climate change."

Dangerous Plants

- Ricin is extracted from seeds of castor oil plant and is more poisonous than cyanide or snake venom. Even
 minute doses of ricin can be fatal.
- Opium is extracted juice of a poppy & contains morphine. Small quantities of both are used legally as pain pillars and drugs. Both can cause death.
- The death cap is a highly poisonous mushroom. It is responsible for 90 % of deaths. It causes severe diarrhea and vomiting.
- Curare is extracted from the bark of certain trees and is used by South American Indian tribes to tip their arrows when they go for hunting.
- Deadly nightshade is also known as belladonna. It contains a poison called atropine. Less than 10 mg could kill a child.
- Nicotine is a yellow oily liquid found in tobacco. About 50 mg of nicotine would kill an adult.
- The leaves of purple foxglove contain digitalis and eating just a few can be fatal. Digitalis is used in tiny dozes
 to treat people suffering from heart disease.
- Potatoes are safe to eat when cooked, but the stems and leaves of plants contain a poison called solamine. If
 potatoes turn green they may also contain solamine.





Sports



- Set regular eating time and proportion for the three meals (breakfast, lunch and dinner) everyday healthy snacks can be arranged between the two meals.
- 4. Have breakfast everyday.
- Eat at home when possible as food in restaurants and fast food shapes usually contain high colours, high fat and little fiber.
- 6. Relax when you eat and chew slowly.



- Do regular exercises, help with the housework and develop healthy hobbies such as handcrafting, painting and stamp collecting so as to avoid eating snacks when idle.
- 8. Whole day school students should bring their own lunch because catered lunch boxes usually contain a lot of oil, salt and little vegetables. If you have to eat out or order a lunch, you can choose healthy food such as rice with pulses/vegetables.

- 7. By food from unlicensed hawkers/shops.


Oh you! My winsome doll, Who! would learn early to crawl, Promise I would never disavow, And won't let you be low.






